vi. Institutional set-up for liquidity risk management

The Liquidity risk management of the company is governed by Asset Liability Management (ALM) policy. The body set up for management of liquidity risk in Vivriti Capital are as below:



- Board of directors approves strategy, policy and procedures to manage liquidity risk along with liquidity risk tolerance and limits.
- Asset Liability Management Committee (ALCO) instituted by the board members formulates policy, monitor and review liquidity risk on monthly basis.

ALCO comprising of Whole Time Directors along with Treasury monitors asset liability composition by tenor/ interest rate resets, liquidity ratios, cash management, fund raise of the company, disbursement, sell-down of assets, capital allocation, liquidity position of the company on an ongoing basis and under different stress scenarios.

Additionally Risk head, Chief Risk Officer assigned as an independent reviewer to review the liquidity risk management process on a monthly basis and present the analysis to ALCO.
